

66.7% of the total vehicles work by gasoline-powered in 30/6/2013

Central Agency for Public Mobilization and Statistics released today 31/12/2013 a press release on Bulletin of licensed vehicles in 30/6/2013, the most important indicators of the following:

Main Indicators include:

- total number of licensed vehicles 6.86 million vehicles in 30/6/2013 which (2.83 million vehicles by 41.3% in urban governorates, 2.05 million vehicle by 29.9% in
 - governorates of lower, 1.81 million vehicle by 26.4% in governorates of upper, 161.59 thousand vehicles by 2.4% in frontier governorates) of the total vehicles.
- •The Cairo Governorate came in ranked first in terms of number of vehicles by 2.03 million vehicles by 29.6%, followed by Giza by number 836.12 thousand vehicles by 12.2%, and Alexandria ranked third with 614.18 thousand vehicles by 8.9% of total vehicles in 30/6/2013

 •Total number of cars licensed reached
 3.74 million cars by 54.5% of total vehicles in 30/6/2013 and the largest number was for private cars (owners), where reached 3.38 million cars by 90.3%, followed by taxis by number 317.25 thousand cars by 8.5%, and the lowest diplomatic corps cars by number 6.26 thousand by 0.2% of total cars.
- •Total number of licensed buses reached 120.94 thousand bus 1.8% of total vehicles in 30/6/2013, and trips bus came in ranked first by number 37.53 thousand bus by 31.0%, and schools bus ranked last by number 11.05 thousand by 9.2% of total buses.
- •Total number of trucks licensed 965.14 thousand trucks by 14.1% of total vehicles.
- •Total number of trailers 68.70 thousand trailers by 1.0% of total vehicles.
- •Vehicles that consume gasoline ranked first by 4.5 million vehicle by 66.7%, followed vehicles consume diesel by number 1.65 million vehicles by 24.5%, then vehicles that consume gas in ranked third by 589.14 thousand vehicles by 8.7% of total licensed vehicles except (trailers attached customs commercial and temporary diplomatic).
