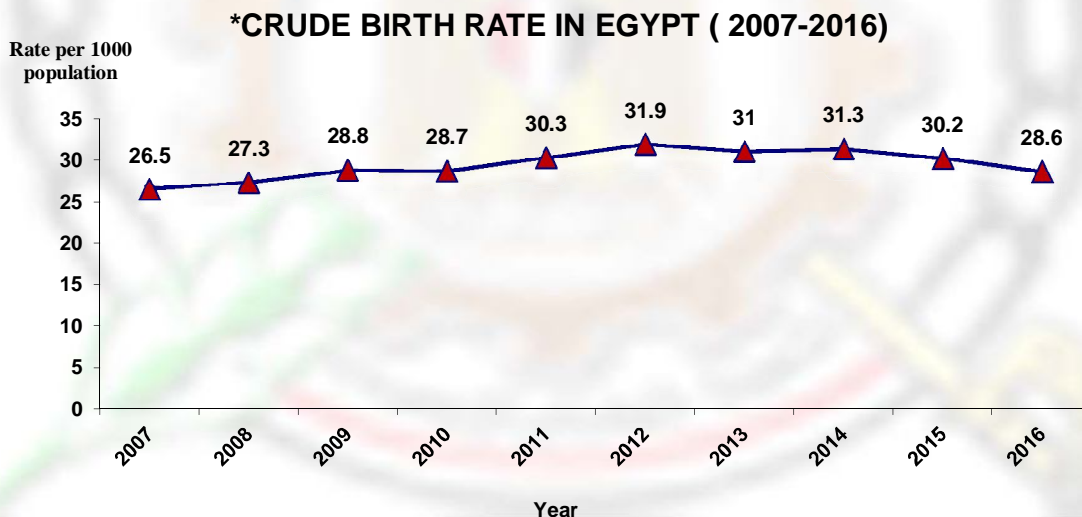
### Decline of the \*Crude Birth Rate 2016

Central Agency for Public Mobilization and Statistics issued today

16 / 7 /2017 Annual Bulletin of Births and Deaths Statistics 2016 .The most important statistical indicators are as follows:

### 2.6 Million Live Births

The number of live births reached 2600173 births in 2016 compared to 2685276 births in 2015, decline of 3.2 %, while the Crude Birth Rate reached 28.6 per thousand in 2016 compared to 30.2 per thousand in 2015.



\* Crude birth rate: Number of live births born during the year per thousand of population in mid year.

### **Stability of Sex Ratio at Birth**

- Sex ratio at birth reached 105 Male /100 Female in 2016, the same as it was in 2015.
- The number of male births reached 1329425 births in 2016 compared to 1372448 births in 2015, decline of 3.1%.
- The number of female births reached 1270748 births in 2016 compared to 1312828 births in 2015, decline of 3.2%.

### **Slight rise of Urban Births Percentage**

- The number of urban births reached 1241469, by 47.7 % of the total number of births in 2016 compared to 1224729 births, by 45.6 % of the total number of births in 2015.
- The number of rural births reached 1358704, by 52.3 % of the total number of births in 2016 compared to 1460547 births, by 54.4 % of the total number of births in 2015.

### **Cairo Ranked First in Terms of Number of Births**

- Cairo was ranked first in terms of number of births by 241248 births in 2016 compared to 251637 births in 2014, decline of 4.1 %.
- South Sinai was ranked the last in terms of number of births by 3372 births in 2016 compared to 3308 births in 2015, increase of 1.9 %.
- Matrouh recorded the highest Crude Birth Rate as it reached 48.6 per thousand in 2016 compared to 49.5 per thousand in 2015.
- South Sinai recorded the lowest Crude Birth Rate as it reached 19.7 per thousand in 2016 compared to 19.6 per thousand in 2015.

## **556 Thousand Deaths**

- The number of deaths reached 556148 deaths in 2016 compared to 573879 deaths in 2015, decline of 3.1 %. Crude Death Rate reached 6.1 per thousand in 2016, compared to 6.5 per thousand in 2015.

## **55.2 % is the Male Deaths of the Total Deaths**

- The number of male deaths reached 307024 in 2016 compared to 313392 in 2015, decline of 2 %.
- The number of female deaths reached 260487 in 2016 compared to 260487 in 2015 an decline of 4.4%.
- The percentage of male deaths reached 55.2% of total deaths.

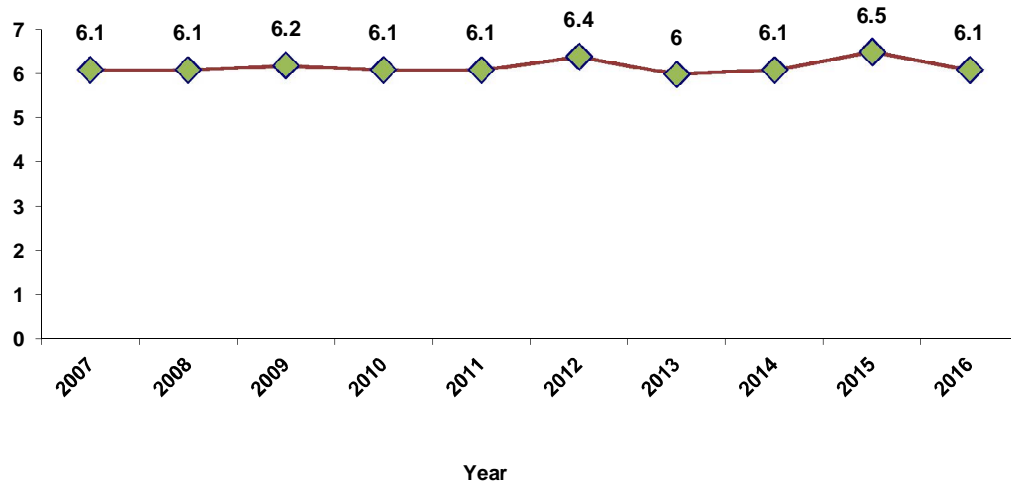
## **8.2 Per Thousand Urban \*Crude Death Rate**

- Urban Crude Death Rate reached 8.2 per thousand in 2016 compared to 8.5 per thousand in 2015 •
- The Rural Crude Death Rate was 4.5 per thousand in 2016 while it was 4.9 in 2015.

### Cairo Ranked First in Terms of the Number of Deaths

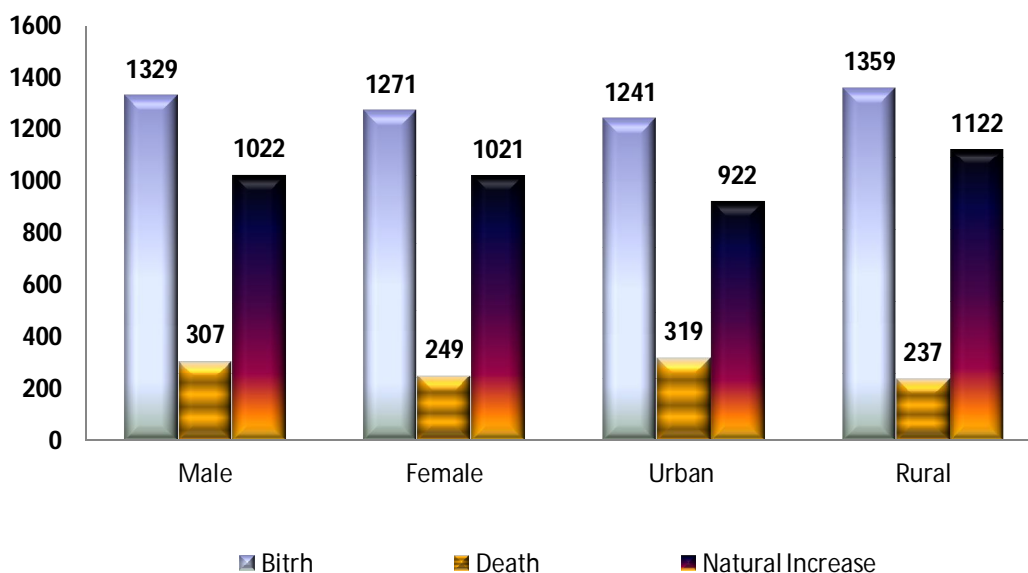
- Cairo was ranked first in terms of the number of deaths which reached 85681 in 2016 compared to 89714 in 2015, a decline of 4.5%.
- South Sinai came in last ranked in terms of number of deaths which reached 634 deaths in 2016 compared to 665 deaths in 2015 by decline of 4.7%.
- Cairo recorded the highest crude death rate 9.0 per thousand in 2016 compared to 9.6 per thousand in 2015.
- South Sinai recorded the lowest crude death rate as it reached 3.7 per thousand in 2016.
- The number of Infant deaths (less than one year) reached 39301 in 2016 Compared to 42050 in 2015, by decline of 6.5 %.

## Decrease of natural increase rate 2016

- Natural increase rate reached 22.5 per thousand in 2016 compared to 23.7 per thousand in 2015.
