



## 3.2 % decrease in the amount of water used for irrigation 2012


Central agency for Public mobilization and statistics Capmas issued on

/ / 2013 the annual bulletin of irrigation and water resource it presents the reduced amounts of irrigation water at Aswan,the field and slat due to lack of water per fadan shress a result of reduce consumption of irrigation water The most important statistical indicators of the annual bulletin as follow:

1. The amount of water used for field irrigation Reached 32.11 billion Cubic meters in 2012 versus 30.87 billion cubic meters in 2011 anincrease of 4%.



- 2. The amount of water used in irrigation at Canal slats 36.93 billion cubic meters in 2012, versus 36.96 billion cubic meters in 2011, a decline of .1%.
- 3. The amount of water used for irrigation at Aswan reached 40.14 billion Cubic meters in 2012 versus 43.22 billion cubic medecline of 7.1%.



- 4. Winter season used 9.28 billion cubic meters of water which is Equivalent to 28.9% of the amount of water used in irrigation.
- 5. Summer season used 19.21 billion cubic meters of water, equivalent to 59.8% of the amount of water used in irrigation .
- 6. Nile season used about 1.34 billion cubic meters of water, equivalent to 4.2% of the amount of water used in irrigation.
- 7. The amount of water used to grow fruit reached 2.28 billion cubic meters, equivalent to 7.1% of the amount of water used in irrigation.
- 8. The amount of water used for irrigation wells three seasons crops and fruit reached 22.76 thousand cubic meters in 2012 versus 12.43 thousand cubic meters in 2011, an increase of \*83.1%.

This is due to an increase in cultivated area for most crops and fruits is the three seasons.
